How to Help a Child Struggling with Reading

I hope you found the audio book information useful in the last 2 posts.

Today includes some other ideas on how to support a child who struggles with reading.

- Enjoy a book together and read with your child.
- Creating a routine of when to read. This helps develop this skill as an adult.
- Reading to your child is important on multiple levels. For example, it builds reading fluency, parent-child connection, and stronger vocabulary skills. I read to my boys at bedtime, which helped us all wind down.
- If they struggle with reading then to keep the pace and interest, adult reads more and alternately allow them to read a small amount (paragraph).
- Discuss the book together asking questions such as – who, what, why when where? E.g., Why do you think that happened? What might happen next?
